By MRT 5-minute walk from City Hall MRT station, 10-minute walk from Esplanade and Raffles Place MRT stations.







TRAVELLING THROUGH THE

TROPICAL RAINFOREST 17 Jan-6 Feb 2025 10am-midnight

Travelling Through the Tropical Rainforest is made up of six colossal sculptural forms that resemble tropical palms. Set against the cityscape and constructed from manmade materials, the work is a commentary on the interplay between the natural and urban environments in a city's evolving landscape. The work confronts audiences wir superscale magnification of what would otherwise go innoticed, and also serves as nature's invitation to be seen and coexist amidst Singapore's urban landscape.

BLADES, SHRAPNEL 17 Jan-6 Feb 2025

Blades, Shrappel is an installation that comprises five laser-emitting grass cutters activated through a series of public performances that simulate synchronised grass-cutting activities. Grass-cutting is a common sight in Singapore, where vegetation is pruned and trimmed regularly in a methodical manner. The activity draws attention to the endless means of manipulation and control in our everyday interactions with nature, as well as the unseen efforts that exist alongside our manicured landscapes.

Angin Cloud imagines the rural industrialisation of a hill side in Vietnam's Central Highlands as an assemblage of Jrai wood sculptures. Environmental extraction has reshaped the highlands and led to the Jrai's displacement from their lands.

Based on a collaboration between Art Labor and the Jrai community, Angin Cloud touches on the dynamic potential for change that is found in water and air— a poetic reference to the evaporation of the forest in the face of industrial farming.




